The college has created a complete students data base regarding their admissions, results etc. All the policies related to human resources, recruitment, training, performance appraisal and financial management are carried out systematically considering the overall interest of the Institute and the stakeholders. The Institute has a well defined administrative structure for effective governance and for building the organizational culture as follows: . 1. Governing Council, 2. Director, 3. Dean Academics, 4. Council of Dean/HODS, 5. Class Faculty Coordinator, 6. Class wise student representatives. The institute functions with decentralized system of administration that has got complete transparency in the decision making process. The Governing council has delegated powers to the Director to conduct the Academics, institutional development, curricular and extracurricular activities. The Director in turn, has delegated certain powers to the Dean academics, department wise Dean/heads and office staff. The Dean/ Head meet on regular basis with Dean Academics and with Director to discuss academic administrative issues and to take appropriate decisions timely. The Dean/HODS assign the responsibility to the faculty and student's representative for smooth functioning of the department as well as of the Institute. The faculty/employee performance is assessed by self appraisal, feedback peer evaluation. Open recruitments, continuous updating, welfare measures, satisfying salary structure, optimal work load, promotion for research participation in seminars conferences coupled with transparent promotional avenues proportionate to performance help to retain the faculty.Institute has integrated Library Management System. All systems are networked and linked. We have networked CCTV camera installed in surrounding areas and in ea

1.1.1 - Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

Shri Ram College offers the variety of courses at Under-Graduate level Basic Science, Computer Application, Business Administration and at Post-graduate level in Education, Physical Education, Fine Arts, Journalism and Mass Communication, Commerce and Bioscience. The aim of Shri Ram College is quality education for which the students are motivates to explore the knowledge in their fields of interest. As our college is affiliated to Ch. Charan Singh University, Meerut, it follows the academic calendar of the affiliating university and based on the circular of University, college prepares its own Academic Calendar. Institute has an active IQAC which suggests various ideas to implement and monitor the implementation. Orientation of students is organized department wise every year for newly admitted students to make them aware of the mechanism of curriculum delivery. Departmental head conducts a meeting for allotment of class and syllabus faculty members. Institute has a system of course files in which lecture plan, student's performances, course coverage status, syllabus, study material which are maintained by faculty and regularly monitored by HOD and inspected by Dean Academics/ Principal from time to time. Suggestion Box is available outside the IQAC office and Principal office and any stakeholder can drop his/her suggestion/ complaints and Principal/IQAC Coordinator check the suggestion and after analysing these suggestions, best possible efforts are made in this regard. Qualitative progress of the college depends on good organisation and administration of its courses. Besides the use of conventional method, various other teaching methods like Quiz, Group Discussion, Demonstrations, Debates, PPT Presentations, Role Play, Allied Projects, Games, Short Films, Industrial Visits, Model making, Add-on practicals, Open Book Tests, Assignments, Videos, Use of charts and graphs to support the curriculum. Case studies are used for effective clear understanding. Remedial classes and extra lectures are also conducted after routine class hours and separate attendance registers are maintained. The students are equipped with employable skills by integrating ICT in almost every curriculum. Class tests/surprise test are held after completion of a unit of the syllabus and periodic review of performance of students is undertaken Feedback is taken periodically for academic review. Concerned authorities conduct regular meetings to review the issues faced while teaching. Field tours and study tour are also organized by Departments to enrich the learning of the prescribed curriculum. The feedback of all stakeholders on curriculum is synthesized and analyzed by the teachers and referred to Director to make remedial efforts. Sincere efforts are made to upgrade faculty competence for efficient delivery of the curriculum. The college believes in "Work is Worship" and to fulfil this we have best staff and infrastructure to meet the requirements. Our team has also been successful in conducting various seminars which include speakers from big corporate houses who share their experiences with our students and enlighten them about the current business conditions. Our staff and faculties help the students to fulfil their dreams to build their career in their fields of interests. We also have Training and Placement Cell , which helps students to get placement.

1.4.2 - How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the institution? (maximum 500 words)

Feedback Obtained

The development of any organization, especially a college, largely depends upon a well-functioning feedback system. It helps in the improvement of students learning, enhancing teaching effectiveness, strengthening student support services etc. It requires a thorough preparation to initiate, launch and implement the feedback system. The structured online/offline feedback is collected from all the stakeholders (Students/ Teachers/ Alumni/ Employers/ Parents) in order to monitor and assess the outcome of the curriculum, it is, then, analyzed and discussed in the lQAC meetings. Constructive views received such as: practicum, smart-classes etc. are incorporated in the system and communicated to head of the institution for improvement and further necessary action. Parents are important stake holders of this system. Parent-teacher meetings are periodically called at department level, and suggestions obtained are regularly analyzed. Feedback is also obtained to evaluate the performance of the faculty inside the class room by his/her students. A feedback to evaluate the facilities provided by the institution is obtained every year from the outgoing final year students. Also feedbacks are obtained from alumni towards their possible contribution to support our students in employment and creating an environment of more placements. Feedback on the teaching-learning process is also received from students as Students Satisfaction Survey based on a structured questionnaire framed by the IQAC of the college. The questionnaire can also be downloaded from the website and Students can drop their filled feedback form in the feedback receiving boxes present in the college campus. Feedback on overall functioning of the college is based on the learning environment of the college, canteen facility, functioning of anti-ragging cell, counseling center, sports facility, infrastructural facilities etc The received feedback is then analyzed by the IQAC and it is also forwarded to the Head of the institution with necessary suggestions based on this feedback. Teachers also provide informal as well as formal feedback to the head of the institution on different academic, administrative and other affairs related to the college. Grievances (if any) and suggestions can be registered to the Grievance Redressal Cell of the college through the Samadhan box fixed near the Principals office, the Cell composition is altered every year at the beginning of academic session. Departments receive feedback from parents either through parent teacher meetings or by telephonically and discuss different issues related to the overall development of their ward.

2.5.2 - Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

At the beginning of the academic session students are informed about the system of continuous internal evaluation. Students are provided with opportunities to learn through lecture sessions by experts in different fields. Faculty members are also encouraged to take on-line courses offered by NPTEL, etc. to upgrade their own knowledge and thereby enhance the teaching-learning process. Relevant industry professionals/subject experts are identified and certain topics are taught by them. Consistent assessment and adaptive tests are conducted. The college has standard pedagogical practices. The course file in which the lesson plan, course outcomes, course delivery details, Students performance, list of resources developed, etc. are documented. Feedbacks were obtained from the students through structured questionnaires related to teaching learning process. Feedback forms on faculty are collected, analysed and a report is prepared which helps to improve the teaching and learning process. Individual faculty performance appraisal and self-evaluation by faculty is done with a view to assess the faculty effectively. Feedback system from Alumni, Parents, employers are also in practice in the college to improve the quality. Workshops, seminars, staff development activities to promote faculty development were organised. Students who are found to be comparatively weak are

given special attention. Assignments, Seminars and Project Works are another major tool of evaluation wherein students are made to perform either individually or in group. The College also gives special attention on Group discussion, Field trip/ excursion and other curriculum activities so as to make the students engage themselves in cognitive learning, learning through exposure, learning through peer review etc.

2.5.3 - Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

University publishes an Academic Calendar for all courses in the beginning of each session. In line with university academic calendar, college prepares its own academic calendar well in advance before the commencement of the semester and adheres to it in a time bound manner. All the academic activities of all the departments are planned and executed as per the academic calendar. Internal assessment exams are conducted department wise as per schedule of the academic calendar. The faculty members of a department, required to teach concerned curricula are deputed to develop a plan of action, subdivide the curricula in coherent units, specify the number of lessons to cover a particular unit thus workout the total number of periods required to cover up a particular course during a semester or a year, as the case may be. The admission process is a centralized process at college level under the guidelines of CCS University and college has constituted Admission Committee for the smooth functioning about all work related to admission. State level Talent Search Examination is conducted for Girls for promoting then in higher education. Deans and Heads of the Departments are expected to prepare of their respective department functional mapping programmes covering orientation, theory and practice related teaching, seminars, community assignments, co-curricular and extra curricular activities and sessional etc covering the proposed activities in around 20/40 weeks for semester/annual course structures as the case may be. End semester/ annual external examination is conducted by the CCS University and internal examination/sessional examination are conducted by college. Examination committee conducts the examination. The college is also an exam center of university examination and competitive examinations.

The institution also appoints supervisory staff for a continuous upkeep and maintenance work throughout the year who provide on the spot guidance to the work force engaged on contract for the purpose. The overall supervision however, rests with the maintenance committee members and is monitored by the administrative head of the Institution. Some representatives of the Managing committee also look after the maintenance activities for the Institution as a whole. The information about the pending maintenance services is usually provided through departmental heads to the head of the institution for taking appropriate action. The management is kept updated about the state of work being undertaken by the Head of the Institution and the Management representative. Construction, maintenance and repairing of buildings, library, classrooms, electrical appliances and other physical infrastructure as communication services, security guard, office expenses, travelling allowances, CCTV surveillance etc. of Shri ram college are being done by the decision of Head of the institute with management. The Institution has proactively augmented the infrastructure to keep pace, rather faster, with its academic growth. Although, an envious community support in our phenomenal growth multifoldly in respect of students' strength consequent to our community sensitization programs, have put challenging demands on the management for rapid infrastructural expansion, yet the founders of the Trust and the college have managed to keep pace with the academic requirements on their own resources and support from the community. Besides, help from the Shi Ram Charitable Trust, M/S Madan Construction Co. initially founded by the Chairman and now being looked after by Er. A proposal was sent to the management of SRGC by the IQAC, SRC to give a thought and setup a Solar Plant to initiate energy conservation and environmental consciousness program. The management accepted this proposal and Solar Panels of the capacity of 160 KV were installed on the rooftops of various buildings of SRGC in March-2018. This Solar Energy Plant would fulfill a major part of energy requirement of various buildings including laboratories, classrooms, veranda and pathways etc. of SRGC and also it will help to save environment. The college has already been using LED lights for lowering the consumption of electricity during darkness in day time and in the evening. The notices, board, placards have been posted on the walls and polls indicating save energy/electricity, switching off the equipements when they are not in use etc. Our Campus is an obvious lush green campus which has lot of fruit bearing trees including mango, jamun, bel along with other plants and green area. The green area in the campus is almost 70 of total area other then built area. A well functioning Rain Water Harvesting System is also maintained in the campus. 7.1.7 - Initiatives taken by the institution to make the campus eco-friendly (at least five)

Shri Ram College includes environmental awareness and energy conservation in its priorities. Keeping this objectives in view SRC organises various events through NSS programmes where environment awareness is created amongst masses, besides this awareness campaigns, cleanliness drives, Shramdaan, etc. are also organised. Under Swachh Bharat Abhiyan initiated by Honble Prime Minister of India SRC maintains complete cleanliness in and around the campus. SRC spends lacs of rupees on multi acres wide, green, clean, well-maintained and eco-friendly campus with rain water harvesting unit and Compost pit which are maintaining by the Lawns and Garden Committee. Lawns Garden committee has been formed for the identification and preservation of the natural resources present in the college campus and for regular monitoring. SRC also organises through screenings of movies and documentaries, experts talks and competitive event on issues related to environment and social values. Tree plantation is also done on regular basis on special occasion as Teachers' Day, Founders' Day, Environment Day, Earth Day etc. Use of plastic is discouraged at the same time chewing of pan-masala, smoking has been made strictly prohibited in campus. The department of Fine Arts usage waste material to create artistic material with an objective that every student knows the creative uses of waste materials in their basic life. SRC also promotes paperless working. SRC does not present the gift made by plastic rather we present our guests the saplings, inspiring them for environmental consciousness. ERP software used to reduce the use of paper. Solar power installations:-160 KVA Solar Power Panel is installed in March 2018 on the rooftops of buildings in the campus as the use of alternative eco-friendly energy resources.

There for from 2016-17 onwards a special scheme for girls aspirant was started in the name of Talent Search Expedition to facilitate poor and talented girl students to enjoy their technical and professional education. Under this scheme a competitive examination was conducted in the month of June 2016 for session 2017-18, through which a concession in the fees upto 100 was given based on the performance in the test for taking admission in various courses run by the SRGC. This year 81 girls were benefited through TSE. This policy is adopted by all institute under the Shri Ram Group of Colleges. In the same line Shri Ram College believes in sensitising its students to be aware of Gender Equality and equal treatment with the other gender specially for women. A series of programs are conducting by different department through which students are made aware of women status in the present Indian society and they are sensitised that a woman has equal rights and respect as man. So it should be given proper attention that a girl is not teased, harassed, insulted or assaulted. They should be treated with respect and dignity. Special counselling session for boys are also conducted throughout the year. Placard and flex-boards and other means are used for a wider awareness throughout the campus. Shri Ram College also addresses the issue of imparting education in rural areas. Therefore more attention is paid on the students from rural areas in and round radius of 70 km. (approx) of Muzaffarnagar. A special team was nominated for carrier counselling of students studying in rural areas so that many needy students got benefited for taking right decision for their future planning and higher studies. Poor students are also benefited by given some financial support on the recommendation of our faculty members for taking admission in higher studies in our college. College provided transport facility to commute at all main routes from rural areas at economic cost.
