Principal's Annual Report

Session-2020-21

We are pleased in presenting the annual report of Shri Ram College, Muzaffarnagar, documenting its development and the achievement for the year 2020-21. The turmoil of 2020 was enough to shake anyone's confidence. The global pandemic disrupted how we work, celebrate, or even smile at each other in passing. In spite of Covid pandemic, college has conducted many events and successful stories. This can be attributed to the dedication and team spirit of the faculties, staff, students and members of the management.

Shri Ram College, Muzaffarnagar was established in the year 2004 as a self-financed, multi-faculty affiliated college which was accredited with grade 'A' by NAAC on 24-05-2016. Shri Ram College is permanently affiliated to Ch. Charan Singh University, Meerut. Shri Ram College presently offered total twenty two programmes in the session 2020-21, out of which, fourteen are UG and eight are PG programmes. It is one of the largest affiliated colleges of CCS University in reference of number of programmes and number of students. The College has been progressing at a remarkable pace with sustained growth and spiraling enhancement in quality of educational and other operations till the year 2020-21. The College, facing some challenges due to being situated in a comparatively backward border area of the NCR and thus without a level playing-field with regard to national competitiveness has made a tremendous growth in terms of strength and quality. All the members (Authority, faculty, staff and students) responsible for its operations and the community deserve all the credit of this growth under the overall leadership and patronage of Dr. S.C. Kulshrestha, the Chairman of Shri Ram Group of Colleges.

Total number of students enrolled in the session 2020-21 was 3802. Total 1125 seats were earmarked for reserved categories as per the rules of GoI/State Government where total 931 students were enrolled from these categories, which constitute 82.75% of the total earmarked seats.

2. Admissions

The College takes the admissions on its first priority, in the present session 2020-21 an extensive admissions campaign through publicity and counselling was conducted in accordance with the College policy of encouraging the students from comparatively deprived sections of society and providing better opportunity for women, minority and poor students. At the entry level total 2390 seats were available in 14 UG and 8 PG Programmes where 1588 students were enrolled in first year.

3. Orientation and Induction Programmes

As per policy of the College, Orientation Programmes were organized in all departments in the beginning of the session for the first year students to make them feel comfortable at new campus and new programmes of study. In these Orientation Programmes, rules of the college were discussed with the students. Sessions of personality development/communication skills and English language/common subjects such as mathematical practice were delivered for bridging the gap between their courses of study of their selected UG and PG programmes. Sessions on library, laboratories and hostel rules & regulations and code of conduct were also conducted.

4. Students' Support

Students' participation in all its activities, wherever desirable, is encouraged as a policy of Shri Ram College. In this session also the students' participation was ensured on priority in terms of representation and membership of various committees. The students were got engaged in the IQAC, Discipline Committee, Students' Welfare Committee, Hostel Committee, Scholarship Committee, Cultural Committee etc. Students' representatives were nominated for various committees and they actively participated and their assigned duties very well. As

a result of students' participation and cooperation the College could be able to extend its help 2296 students in getting their fee concession and scholarships for different classes from Shri Ram Charitable Trust. Most of economically weaker students were benefited by Social Welfare Department of Uttar Pradesh; as a result, a total amount of Rs.14149123/-was received by 968 students of Shri Ram College.

5.University Examinations and Results

Among twenty two programmes, Shri Ram College achieved 100% result in nine programmes B.Sc. Biotechnology, B.Ed., B.Voc. (Yoga), M.Sc. Microbiology, M.Sc. Biotechnology, MFA, M.P.Ed., M.Ed. and M.Sc. Computer Science. The pass percentage in six programmes was 95% and above. Total 1109 students passed out of 1184; hence result of the college was 93.66%. The Covid-19 pandemic was slightly effected the examination result.

6. University Toppers and Rankers

In this academic session Shri Ram College recorded marvelous achievement as number of students secured several medals and positions in the University merit list. Six Gold Medals/ 1st Positions in the University by Ms. Niharika Rani in MFA (Applied Arts), Mr. Shivanshu Kumar in MFA (D&P), Ms. Sadaf in MFA (Fashion Designing), Ms. Ayushi Aggrawal in MJMC, Mr. Anmol Tyagi in BFA and Ms. Komal Rani in B.Voc. (Yoga) were achieved. Nine students got Silver Medals/ 2nd Positions in the University as Mr. Siddharth in BFA, Mr. Vishank Chaudhary in MFA(Applied arts), Ms. Anjali in MFA(D&P), Ms. Eshita Arora in MFA(Fashion Designing), Ms. Zeba Husaini in M.Sc. (Microbiology), Ms. Vaishali Baliyan in B.P.Ed., Ms. Priyanka Rana in BPES, Ms. Seema Vinod in B.Voc. (Yoga) and Mr. Navneesh Bhardwaj in MJMC. Five students got Bronze Medal/ 3rd Positions in the University as Mr. Akhilesh Verma in MJMC, Ms.

Sukirti in BFA, Mr. Kulwant Singh Kori in MFA (Applied Arts), Ms. Somya Gupta in MFA (D&P), Ms. Simran Karanwal in MFA (Fashion Designing). Four students got 4th position and nine students got 5th position in university merit in different programmes.

7. Training and Placements

Training and placement Cell conducted various training programmes, Mock Interview, career counseling. Coaching was also given for competitive examinations such as, Preparation of Technical aptitude test, Numeric Arithmetic Method Classes for competitive exam, UPJEE B.Ed. entrance, TET, NET. Preparation of Physical Fitness Test for University Level entrance examination for those students who want to take admission in M.P.Ed. & B.P.Ed. Courses, also conducted by the college. Total 1894 students were take participation in those activities.

T&P Cell also conducted number of placement activities on-campus and off-campus. 165 students placed in more than 44 companies through on-campus and off-campus drives.

8. Faculty, Other staff and Their Achievements

In the College, a total of 183 faculty members worked, during the year, as full time faculty, out of which 65 were holding Ph.D. degree. Three teachers were currently guiding Ph.D. research as recognized supervisors. Departments held discussions on various themes in Saturday Club activity and also held 04 in-house FDPs of more than a week duration. Faculty participated in various research and development activities. Appreciation awards were received by some faculty members for excellent work in community and extension activities. The faculty members also participated and contributes in number of co-, extra-curricular, cultural and other similar activities.

9. Research Projects and Grants

A grant of Rs. 543330/-was sanctioned from five local industries for project/ consultancy work of our teachers and students.

10. Publications

College published journal *Prabhandan Guru*. Twenty Six research papers were published in national/international journals. Two book chapter was published by the faculty members.

11. Entrepreneurship Development and Innovation Centre

Shri Ram College has its own fully functional Intellectual Property Rights & Entrepreneurship Development (IPR&ED) Cell which supervises the Centre for Innovation which is working for all the students of Shri Ram Group of Colleges. In this year the Centre ran projects and training for students. The College organised few webinars also this year.

12. Academic Activities

The College conducted four trainings programmes for teaching staff, three training programmes for non-teaching staff along with four FDPs for improving the skills of teaching and non-teaching staff. Nineteen Value Added/ Certificate Courses were running throughout the year out of which two new courses were started this year for the students in various fields of study. Departments held academic events like seminars, workshop, guest lectures, quiz competitions, group discussions, debates and science exhibition etc. for the students. For teachers, different activities were held in almost all the departments including discussions on current and other relevant issues during this year under Saturday Tea Club meetings.

13. International Relations and Other Collaboration

The College established collaborations as MoUs were signed between Shri Ram College and other organisations. MoUs which was going to expired, had been renewed. Workings with previously associated members was also continued and remained in progress as faculty exchange and student exchange programmes with IIMT Saharanpur and with CHSM Bulandshahr.

14. Extra Curricular Activities/ Extension Service

Shri Ram College, as its general policy, pays attention towards the overall development of students, during this session this aspect was kept in mind. Many industry tours/ excursions/ cultural tours were conducted in the session 2020-21 by different departments to improve learning of students. More than 25 extension activities including workshops were conducted by the College and some of them were in collaboration with other institutes/ organizations. Annual Function of the college 'COLORS' was organised.

15. Annual and Other Sports Tournaments

Annual Sports Meet was organized by the College where number of sports activities were conducted. Due to Covid, the University were not organized any sports competitions.

16. Alumni Meet

Alumni Meet was organized on 31/12/2020 and Alumni Association was reconstituted. The alumni actively participated and organised a day-long programme including introduction and visit to respective departments, lunch was also served. During this meeting suggestions about restructure the Body of the Alumni Association were invited. More than 150 members were present in the meeting.

17. Awards and Recognitions

Shri Ram College, independently or as part of SRGC, has received many recognitions and awards for various aspects of quality and for participation in the extension activities directly or through its Chairman Dr. S.C. Kulshreshtha.

18. Academic Administrative Audit and Quality Audits

Shri Ram College, as a routine exercise, conducted Academic Administrative Audit (AAA) was conducted to gauge and improve the quality parameters in the college. College has also got the ISO certification.

19. Feedback Analysis

Feedbacks from all stakeholders were collected and analysis, the recommendation, after analysis, were sent to the management and University. Efforts were made to implement the suggestions so received, as much as possible.

20. IQAC Meeting

IQAC conducted regular meeting with all HoD, Committee coordinators, and with all stake holders for ensuring quality work. Total ten meetings were held by IQAC during the session.
