Principal's Annual Report

Session-2021-22

We are pleased in presenting the annual report of Shri Ram College, Muzaffarnagar, documenting its development and the achievement for the year 2021-22. Shri Ram College is the first and the largest college of Shri Ram Group of Colleges. The global pandemic affected every aspect of life including education in the year 2020-21 and some splashes in this year too. In spite of this, college has conducted many events and successful stories. This can be attributed to the dedication, motivation and team spirit of the faculties, staff, students and members of the management.

Shri Ram College, Muzaffarnagar was established in the year 2004 as a self-financed, multi-faculty affiliated college. Apart from the some challenges due to being situated in a comparatively backward border area of the NCR and thus without a level playing-field with regard to national competitiveness, the college jump from earlier NAAC accreditation grade "A" to grade 'A++' on 07-06-2022. All the members (Authority, faculty, staff and students) responsible for its operations. Students and the community deserve all the credit of this achievement under the overall leadership and patronage of Dr S.C. Kulshrestha, the Chairman of Shri Ram Group of Colleges. This year pave the way of establishment of Maa Shakumbhari University, Saharanpur, under the Uttar Pradesh State Universities Act, 2019 & the U.P. State Universities Amendment Bill 2021. It is formed to provide affiliation and monitoring to all the colleges belonging to the three districts Muzaffarnagar, Sharanpur and Shamli. Shri Ram College was permanently affiliated to Ch. Charan Singh University, Meerut but with the establishment of the Maa Shakumbhari University, Saharanpur, first year of

every programme migrated under the affiliation of the MSU Saharanpur. Our College was one of the large affiliated colleges of CCS University in reference of number of programmes and number of students now become the largest affiliated college of Maa Shakumbhari University, Saharanpur. Shri Ram College offered total twenty-three programmes in the session 2021-22, outof which, fifteen are UG and eight are PG programmes. There was no student enrollment in one offered PG programmeM.Sc (CS) in 2021-22. One new programme B.Sc (Home Science) is also introduced in this session. This year also become the witness of implementation of NEP 2020, which introduces a flexible entry and exit system for undergraduate programs. Students now have the option to enter and exit a degree program at different stages, receiving due recognition for the completed years of study. The National Education Policy 2020 emphasis on flexibility in course choices is a significant step towards creating a more inclusive, adaptable, and student-centric education system. The integration of vocational education, technological advancements and assessment reforms, further contribute to a more holistic and relevant learning experience. With the implementation of NEP-2020 in traditional programmes in this year, students of traditional programmes now stood at par with the professional programmes or even better.

The College has been progressing at a remarkable pace with sustainable growth and spiraling enhancement in quality of education and other operations till the session 2021-22.

The following is the brief report on the major activities performed in Shri Ram College in the session 2021-22

1. Strength of Students

Total number of students studied in the session 2021-22 was 4,607, out of which 4,210 were related to the UG programmes and 417 were in the PG programmes. Total 1110 seats were earmarked for reserved categories as per the rules of

GoI/State Government where total 1025 students were enrolled from these categories, which constitute 92.34% of the total earmarked seats. In the present sessions 2021-22, percentage of enrolled SC/ST students to the total enrolled strength was 16% and percentage of enrolled OBC students to the total admitted strength was 30.60% of total enrolled students. Total 824 girl students were admitted in 1st year out of 2199 students during the session, it shows that more than 37% of girl candidates were admitted this year in the college.

In this session 2021-22, 1722 girls and 2885 boys are studying in the college so more than 37% girls students are studying in the college.

DEMOGRAPHIC DETAILS OF STUDENTS (Session 2021-22)

2. Admissions

The College takes the admissions on its first priority, in the present session2021-22 an extensive admissions campaign through publicity and counseling was conducted. In accordance with the College policy of encouraging the students from comparatively deprived sections of society and providing better opportunityforfemale, minority and poor students through Talent Search Expedition (TSE). TSE was conducted offline and online mode in this year. At the entry level total 2280 intake was available in 15UG and 8PG Programmes where 2,221 students admitted initially but 2199 were enrolled in the first year of all UG & PG programmes.

3. Orientation and Induction Programmes

As per policy of the College, individual Department prepares detailed Orientation and Induction programmes in consultation with Principal of the College, IQAC, Coordinator, Dean Academic and senior faculty members. In this session too, Orientation Programmes were organized in all departments in the beginning of the session for the first year students to make them feel comfortable at new campus and new programme of study. In these Orientation Programmes, rules of

the college were discussed with the students. Sessions of personality development/communication skills and English language/ common subjects such as mathematical practicewas delivered for bridging the gap between their courses of study of their selected UG and PG programmes. Sessions on library, laboratories and hostel rules & regulations and code of conduct were also conducted.

4. Students' Participation in College Administration

Students' participation in college operation, wherever desirable, is encouraged as the policy of Shri Ram College. In this session also, the students' participation was ensured on priority in terms of representation and membership of various committees. The students were got engaged in the IQAC, Discipline Committee, Students' Welfare Committee, Hostel Committee, Scholarship Committee, Cultural Committee etc. Students' representatives were nominated by the head of department after screening the choices for various committees and students actively participated and do happily their assigned duties.

5. Student' Support services

College provides various student support services such as Personalized Academic Advising, Mentorship Programs, Student Learning Center/Peer-Tutoring, Student Employment Services, Academic Support, Accommodation Services, Student Clubs, Financial Assistance and Student Counseling Services. As a result of students support services, 741 students got fee concession from TSE exam which total amount of Rs. 3441610 and 36 students got scholarships for different classes from Shri Ram Charitable Trust worth Rs. 314800. Most of economically weaker students were benefited by Social Welfare Department of Uttar Pradesh; as a result, more than 2500 students got scholarship.

6. University Examinations and Results

Among twenty one programmes, Shri Ram College achieved 100% result in ten programmes BFA, BPES, B.Ed., BP.Ed, B.Voc. (Yoga), M.Sc. Microbiology,

M.Sc. Biotechnology, MFA, M.P.Ed. and M.Ed. The pass percentage in six programmes was 95% and above. Result of remaining 5 programs was also good. Total 1252 students passed out of 1291in final year; hence result of final year students of the college was 96.98%.

7. University Toppers and Rankers

In this academic session Shri Ram College recorded marvelous achievement as number of students secured many medals and positions in the University merit list. Eight Gold Medals/ 1st positions in the University merit by students as: Ms. Deepika in BFA, Ms. Ayushi Jain in MFA (Applied Arts), Ms. Sadqa Arshadin MFA(D & P), Ms. Shaily in MFA (Fashion Designing), Ms. Anya Tomar in MFA (Textile Designing), Km Kujeet Kaur in MP.Ed, Ms. Jahanvi Dahiya in M.Sc (Biotech) and Ms. Vanshika in M.Sc (Microbiology) were achieved. Nine students got Silver Medals/ 2ndPositions in the University merit as Mrs. Soni Srivastava in BFA, Ms. Aditi Choudhary in MFA (Applied Arts), Km Minakshi Choudhary in MFA (D & P),Km Varsha in MFA (Fashion Designing), Ms. Anju Sharma in MFA (Textile Designing), Mr. Mohd Shehzad Gaurin MJMC, Ms. Palak Sharma in BPES, Ms. Bhavna Yadavin MP.Ed and Ms.Iqra Khanam in B.Voc (Yoga).Six students got Bronze Medal/ 3rd Positions in the University as Ms. Divya Raghuvanshi in M.Sc (Biotech), Ms. Shikha in MFA (Applied Arts), Km Radha Jagdish in MFA (D & P), Ms. Urvashi in MFA (Fashion Designing), Mr. Tarun Panwar in MP.Ed, and Ms. Vaishali Tayalin B.Voc (Yoga). Seven students got 4th position and five students got 5th position in university merit in different programmes. Many more positions also secured by our students in the university merit of toppers.

7. Training and Placements

Training and placement Cell conducted various training programmes, Mock Interview, career counseling. Coaching was also given for competitive examinations such as, Preparation of Technical aptitude test, Numeric Arithmetic

Method Classes for competitive exam, UPJEE B.Ed. entrance, TET, NET, Preparation of Physical Fitness Test (for those students who want to take admission in M.P.Ed. &B.P.Ed. Courses) for University Level entrance examination is also conducted by the college. Total 1894 students were take participation in those activities.

T&P Cell also conducted number of placement activities on-campus and off-campus.444 students placed in more than 73 companies and school/colleges through on-campus and off-campusdrives.

8. Faculty, Other staff and Their Achievements

In the College, a total of 201 regular faculty members worked during the year as full-time faculty, 03 faculty worked on temporary basis and out of these 67 were holding Ph.D.degree. Twelve faculty worked as a Guest faculty. Four teachers were currently guiding Ph.D. research as recognized supervisors. Departments held discussions on various themes in Saturday Club activity and also held more than 14 online and offline FDPs, which includes 03 FDPs of more than a week duration. More than 150 research papers published by the faculty in national & international journals. Appreciation awards were received by some faculty members for excellent work in community and extension activities. The faculty members also participated and contribute in number of co-, extra-curricular, cultural and other similar activities.

9. Research Projects and Grants

A grant of Rs.588,000/-was sanctioned from seven local industries for 9 project/consultancy work of our teachers and students for nine departments. Rs. 40,000 worth grant also received from Shri Ram Charitable Trust (SRCT) internally for three projects. College management regularly support faculty members for research work.

10. Publications

College published two issues of journal "*Prabhandan Guru*" in this session. More than 150 research papers were published in national/international journals. Two conference proceeding were also published by the college. More than 8 books and More than 90 articles/book chapter was published by the faculty members in various journals/proceeding of conferences.

11. Entrepreneurship Development and Innovation Centre

Shri Ram College has its own fully functional Intellectual Property Rights & Entrepreneurship Development cell (IPR&ED Cell) which supervises the Centre for Innovation which is working for all the students of Shri Ram Group of Colleges to promote innovative work. In this year the Centre ran projects and training for students. The College organized few seminars and webinars also this year.

12. Academic Activities

The College conducted four trainings programmes for teaching staff, three training programmes for non-teaching staff along with four FDPs for improving the skills of teaching and non-teaching staff. Twenty Value Added/ Certificate Courses were running during the year out of which more than 50% addon/certificate courses were started this year for the students in various fields of study. Departments held academic events like seminars, workshop, guest lectures, quiz competitions, group discussions, debates and science exhibition etc. for the students. For teachers, different activities were held in almost all the departments including discussions on current and other relevant issues during this year under Saturday Tea Club meetings.

13. International Relations and Other Collaboration

The College established collaborations as MoUs were signed between Shri Ram College and other organizations. MoUs which was going to expired, had been renewed. Workings with previously associated members was also continued and remained in progress as faculty exchange and student exchange programmes with

HMT Saharanpur and with CHSM Bulandshahr. One new MoU was signed with S D (PG) College Muzaffarnagar for teaching and research work.

14. Extra Curricular Activities/ Extension Service

Shri Ram College,as its general policy, pays attention towards the overall development of students, during this session this aspect was kept in mind. Many industry tours/ excursions/ cultural tours were conducted in the session 2021-22 by different departments to improve learning of students. More than 25 extension activities including workshops were conducted by the College and some of them were in collaboration with other institutes/ organizations. Annual Function of the college 'COLORS' was organised.

15. Annual and Other Sports Tournaments

Annual Sports Meet was organized by the College where number of sports activities was conducted. Due to Covid pandemic, the Affiliating University were not organized any Inter-university sports competitions. Students performed in various activities in many other universities with the support of the college faculty.

16. Alumni Meet

Alumni Meet was organized and Alumni Association was reconstituted as per the requirement by the Alumni members. The alumni actively participated and organised a day-long programme including introduction and visit to respective departments, lunch was also served. During this meeting suggestions about restructure the Body of the Alumni Association were invited. More than 200 members were present in the meeting and 12 speakers shared their views. Some members contributed financially for the development of alumni.

17. Awards and Recognitions

Shri Ram College, independently or as part of SRGC,has received many recognitions and awards for various aspects of qualityand for participation in the extension activities directly or through its Chairman Dr. S.C. Kulshreshtha.

18. Academic Administrative Audit and Quality Audits

Shri Ram College, as a routine exercise, conducted Academic Administrative Audit (AAA), Internal and external financial Audit, Energy Audit/ Green audit etc. These were conducted to gauge and improve the performance/quality in the college. College has also got the ISO certification.

19. Feedback Analysis

Feedbacks from all stakeholders on the curriculum were collected and analyzed, the recommendation, after analysis, was sent to the management and University. Various Add-on/certificate courses were conducted to meet out the requirement of the industry for the betterment of the students. Efforts were made to implement the suggestions so received, as much as possible.

20. IQAC

IQAC conducted many regular meeting with all HoD, Committee coordinators, and with all stake holders for ensuring quality work and IQAC coordinator invite suggestions from all the members and try to implement them. IQAC made 08 meetings with all IQAC members specifically during the session. Minutes of meetings are available on college website. As the result of efforts of IQAC members, College achieved A++ grade by NAAC in June 2022.
