## **Principal's Annual Report**

**Session : 2016-17**

Shri Ram College, Muzaffarnagar, a NAAC 'A' grade accredited self-financed multi-faculty college, was established in the year 2004 and accreditation was declared in May 2016. The College has recorded sustained growth and intensification of its quality in various operations in current year of 2016-17.

### **1. Admissions**

In year 2016-17 five new programmes were introduced three at UG level B.Sc. (PCM), B.Sc. (CBZ) and BPES and two at PG level MFA and MJMC. So from the session 2016-17 total number of Programmes in the College increased to twelve at UG and eight at PG level. A total of 1571 students were admitted in first year against 1845 seats in the different programmes. An extensive admission counseling, publicity and TSE were executed by the College under policy of encouraging deprived sections, women, minority and poor students in the process of admissions.

### **2. Strength of Students**

A total of 3240 students were enrolled for their study, 2886 in UG and 354 in PG, in the college during the session. Total 920 students were enrolled in reserved category which is 99.78% of the 922 seats earmarked for reserved category as per GOI/ State Government rules.

### **3. Orientation and Induction Programmes**

As per our trend, in the beginning of the session, Orientation Programmes were organized by all the departments for entry level students to make them familiar with new campus and new programme of study. In Orientation Programme a few basic concepts to bridge the gap between secondary education and the need of the undergraduate programme were explained.

Development of Communication Skill a special course on English Language was also offered to the students. Induction program for new faculties and orientation program for all faculties were also organized.

#### **4. Students' Support**

Students took an active participation in various Committees as student representatives such as in IQAC, Discipline, Students' Welfare, Hostel, Scholarship, Cultural Committee, Scholarship Committee etc. and performed their assigned duties in many cultural/ administrative/ extension programmes. Due to the participation of the students in these committees the College could be able to understand and help students more efficiently, such as Shri Ram Charitable Trust could extend a financial support to 735 students of different classes with the help of students' cooperation. The students from reserved categories and economically weaker were benefited by Social Welfare Department of U.P. where an amount of Rs. 21623240 was received as fee compensation of 1120 students of the College.

#### **5. Results of University Examinations**

In the year 2016-17 students from three UG programmes, Microbiology, Journalism and Mass Communication and Teacher Education, secured 100% result whereas among eight PG programmes the students of four PG programmes, Biotechnology, Computer Science, Teacher Education and Commerce, secured 100% result. Pass percentage in B.Com. was 96%, in BCA was 93% and in BBA was 92%. Other program had also achieved good result.

#### **6. University Toppers and Rankers**

In this academic session 201617 one Gold Medal was and 1<sup>st</sup> position in the University merit was secured by Km. Tanya Rana of Bachelor of Fine Arts.

#### **7. Internal Quality Assurance Cell**

The College has its fully functional Internal Quality Assurance Cell which has been constituted as per the NAAC guidelines. The meetings of IQAC were conducted on regular basis with HoDs, Committee Coordinators and other stakeholders. During this session eight meetings were conducted.



## **8. Training and Placements**

Training and Placement Cell conducted various career counseling sessions and training programmes for competitive examinations. Cell organized various placement activities on- and off- campus. About 207 students were placed in more than 50 companies through on-campus and off-campus placements drives.

## **9. Faculty, Other staff and Their Achievements**

A total of 164 full time faculty members were working in the College out of which 65 had Ph.D. degrees. All the Departments, in their Saturday Activity, held discussions on various contemporary themes and also conducted in-house FDP Programmes. Many faculty members participated in seminar/ conferences with a financial support of the College. Faculty members also participated in various research programmes, co-curricular, cultural and extension activities. Appreciation awards were received by some faculty members for excellent work/ extension activities. Sufficient number of lab technician, lab assistant, office staff and other staff was available in the College. Two training programmes were conducted for each teaching and non-teaching staff members this year.

## **10. Research Projects and Grants**

Research Project granted by the Indian Council of Philosophical Research was completed this year. Project with MIT-USA was also completed during this year. An amount of Rs. 30000/- was received from local industries, Jain Carbons Pvt. Ltd. and IIA, Muzaffarnagar, as a grant for Project/ consultancy work.

## **11. Publications**

Total 51 research papers, 9 articles/ book chapters were published by the faculty members from various departments including Business Administration, Bio Sciences and Basic Science, Computer Application, JMC, Education in different national/ international journals were published. The SRGC published the journal *Prabhandan Guru* with cooperation of IQAC, Shri Ram College in which papers of various persons were published.

## **12. Entrepreneurship Development and Innovation Centre**

An Innovation Centre of Shri Ram Group of Colleges was running till the last academic session. This year an Intellectual Property Rights & Entrepreneurship Development (IPR&ED) Cell was established by the College that adopted the Innovation Center. The IPR&ED Cell adopted all the projects of Innovation Centre which were already running through the last year. Awareness Programmes on Intellectual Property Rights and an International Seminar on Waste Management System in Muzaffarnagar City were organised this year by this Cell. Shri Ram College is running few projects under IPR&ED Cell.

### **13. Academic Activities**

College conducted two training for Teaching staff, two training for non-teaching staff and one FDP for teaching staff. Induction and Orientation program were also organized for the faculty members which helped in improving the working of teaching and nonteaching staff. Six new Value added/ Certificate Courses were started this year and hence total Twelve such courses were offered to the students for better exposure in various fields which are not covered in the routine syllabus. Departments held academic events for students like seminars, workshop, guest lectures, quiz competitions, group discussions, debates, science exhibition etc. For teachers, Saturday Tea Club meetings/ activities were held in almost all departments and discussions on current issues/ some academic activities were conducted during that time.

### **14. International Relations and Other Collaboration**

This year two new MoUs were signed by the College; one with IIMT, Kota, Saharanpur and the other with Himalayan Management and Development Resource Institute (HiMADRI), Rishikesh. The College continued working on the previous MoU in collaboration with MIT-USA which was signed for Municipal Water Management of Muzaffarnagar town. Students exchange and faculty exchange was performed by IIMT Saharanpur and CHSM, Bulandshahar.

### **15. Extra-curricular/ Extension Activities**

This year number of Extra-curricular/ Extension activities were organised. many industry tours/ excursions were conducted in the session by various departments to improve learning to students. More than twelve extension activities were conducted by the college and some of them were in



collaboration with the other institutes/ organizations. A grand cultural event as the Annual Function of the College 'COLOR' was organised from 30/12/2016 to 1/1/2017.

#### **16. Annual and Other Sports Tournaments**

An Annual Sports Meet was organized by the College along with many other sports activities which were organised as regular activity. College students won many awards in the sports events, some of them were, First Position in CCS University Intercollegiate Badminton Tournament; First Position in CCS University Intercollegiate Volleyball Tournament; Winner in VIZZY Trophy Tournament by BCCI (Cricket); represented UP Cricket Team in C.K. Nayudu Trophy Under-23. Students of the College participated in All India Wushu Tournament, All India Shooting Tournament, North Zone Interuniversity Volleyball Tournament, Under 19 Cricket Tournament, North Zone Hockey Tournament etc. and won several awards and prizes.

#### **17. Alumni Meet**

A meeting of Alumni Association Members was conducted on 31/12/2016 at SRC Auditorium. The Alumni Meet was organized on 28/06/2017 where more than 85 Alumni members attended. The function was organised at SRC Auditorium as a day-long programme which included introduction, visit to respective departments, lunch and general interaction session in which suggestions for the working of Body of the Alumni Association were invited.

#### **18. Awards and Recognitions**

Shri Ram College independently or as a part of Shri Ram Group of Colleges, directly or through its Chairman, received awards/ recognition for various aspects of quality of education, infrastructure or functioning or extension activities etc.

#### **19. Academic Administrative Audit and Quality Audits**

Shri Ram College, as a routine exercise, conducted Academic Administrative Audit (AAA) in the month of March 2017 to gauge and improve the quality parameters in the College.

#### **20. Feedback Analysis**

Feedbacks from all stakeholders were collected in which 508 students, 132 faculty members, 12 employers, 60 parents, 85 alumni participated for giving their opinion on curricula and other related aspects. After analysis, recommendations were sent to the authorities and were tried to implement as much as possible. Student Satisfaction Survey from 624 students had also been conducted by the College for the betterment of the college.
