(1) INTRODUCTION: - The Research Project on "Sufism" is related to that aspect of History and Philosophy which can astound a scholar with its sheer aura, the staggering range of available information as well as by its immense research potential. The enormous challenge before me at the start, was to streamline my study in a manner that would help me to be methodical and meticulous in adhering to the aspects that are central to the main themes of this Research Project. A Study of the history, ideology, doctrines, organized functioning of various Sufi Orders in India, common features and regional variations and the present day relevance of Sufi philosophy- are all those facets of Sufism on which this indepth inquiry has been initiated.

Elements of Communal harmony in Sufi ideology is the base line of my Project. While conducting this in depth study of Indian Sufism and its various aspects, a number of doubts and ambiguities that had come to the mind regarding its historical facts, ideology and authenticity of sources, have been gradually cleared. During this process I have been able to procure the most reliable sources and also learnt to sift the important from the less relevant information. I have also been able to identify some glaring gaps that exist even today in the comparative study of Sufism in various regions of India. It is a known fact that the liberal ideology of Sufism has, in the past, played a seminal role in developing a secular and tolerant society with faith in ideas of service to mankind, unity and peaceful co-existence. With such a rich lineage of tolerance, why is India facing the grave challenges of communal frenzy and intolerance in present times? The present study seeks to examine if the syncretistic influences of Sufism are waning with time or if referring back to Sufi philosophy and taking a cue from history today, shall help to stem the alarming increase in religious fundamentalism and conflicts.

WORK PLAN: - In order to deal with the vast domain of Sufi literature and its numerous sources, it is imperative to follow a well thought out Plan of Action. Details of the same are given below:-

- (1) Drawing up an exhaustive list of all the resources that could possibly help in the research work: - Discovery, documentation, analysis and interpretation of the observations, scholarly articles and information in already published books on Sufism, interaction with eminent historians and academicians who have contributed meaningfully to the study of Sufi history and philosophy, Interviews with Sufi Heads and 'Khadims' of Sufi centers in different parts of India, tapping hitherto unknown sources in the form of Sufi literature, manuscripts, musical compositions and engraving on monuments.
- (2) Adoption of 'The 8-Zone Plan' :- In order to analyze, interpret and get a first hand knowledge of Sufi culture, philosophy, present day organizational structure and following, as well as to quench the desire to see how Sufism still holds a torch of hope in the contemporary context, it is important to make personal visits to various major Sufi centers of India. An important aspect of this research is also to identify the regional variations in Sufi ideology and practices throughout the length and breadth of the country. Over 210 Sufi sites are enlisted in the Sufi circuit published by the ministry of Tourism, Government of India, making India a contemporary epicenter of Sufi Culture in the world today. An 8-Zone approach has been adopted which involves identifying major Sufi Centers in the North, South, East, West, North-East, South West, Upper North and Central regions of India. Some of the sufi centers identified for visiting and conducting this study are located at - Budgam (Srinagar), Sibosagar (Assam), Delhi, Dhar (Madhya Pradesh), Ajmer (Rajasthan), Gulbarga (Karnataka), Mamburam (Kerala), Midnapur (West Bengal), Sirhind (Punjab), and Bahraich (Uttar Pradesh). Apart from these centers, visits may also be undertaken to other Sufi shrines in order to expand the horizons of my research. Effort has been to choose centers in different directions, as well as those associated with different historical Sufi orders in India, so that their common features, beliefs, regional influences and differences in ideology, music, poetry etc. may be identified.

- (c) GUIDANCE FROM EMINENT HISTORIANS who possess vast and valuable knowledge on Sufism and are considered authorities in the field. I am fortunate to have immense co-operation and personal inputs from eminent historians like Prof. S.Z.H. Jafri (Delhi University), Dr. Painuruddin Ahmed (Cotton College Guwahati) and Prof. M. Parvez (Aligarh Muslim University), who are all credited with writing some of the most significant works on Sufism. Important pieces of information from these senior writers and academicians helped me to streamline my work and incorporate some new dimensions to the study.
- (d) VISITS TO SUFI SHRINES AND CENTERS: In order to make in person visits and gather hands on experience of different facets related to Sufism in various parts of the country, a list of Sufi shrines has been prepared by me. 
History of the Rishi Tradition of Sufism in Kashmir: - The Rishi order may be regarded as the Islamic expression of the Kashmir Rishi tradition that long predates the advent of Islam in the region. It is because of the deep roots of this tradition in Kashmir, that the Kashmiris still call their state, 'Rishi Waer' or 'Pir Waer' (the land of Rishis or Pirs). Before the Sufi Rishis, Kashmir valley was already permeated with the tradition of Hindu ascetism and Buddhist renunciation, and Islamic missionaries from foreign lands had begun to make a significant impact on the minds of the people at many places. The Rishi order was founded by Hazrat Nooruddin Noorani who was born in Kemoh and lived from 1379 to 1442 AD. At Charar-i-Sharif, is his tomb, which is deeply venerated even today.



Some significant notings during the visit: -

- The origin of the term 'Rishi' and how it came to be associated with Muslim mystics: According to Janab Mohd. Shafi Shah, the term 'Rishi' seems to have a clear derivation from Sanskrit, and the ascetic and pious lives of Kashmiri Muslim Rishis bear a close resemble to the lives of Hindus 'Rishis' and 'Munis'. He, however, added that it could have also originated from the Persian word 'Rishi' or 'Rish' meaning feathers or wings. He also extended some other explanations on this issue, which shall be discussed in detail.
- The Role of Lal Ded or Lalleshwari in influencing Hazrat Noorani: Lal Ded was a mystic saint of the Kashmiri Shaivite sect, whose famous 'Vaakhs' are popular among Kashmiris of all communities even today, and have long inspired the people of Kashmir. Hazrat Noorani is said to have received 'ma'rifat' or the wealth of spiritual and Gnostic knowledge from Lalleshwari. Her teachings exercized a profound influence on Hazrat Noorani. 'The Ishq-i-haqiqi', according to Haji Younus Ahmad, is 'The love of God' which was combined with austerities, meditation and simplicity and finds echoes in Shaivism and Rishism alike. The path was the same, and hence both Hindus and Muslims of Kashmir venerate the spiritual message in their verses even today.
- Present day followers and influence of Hazrat Noorani and Rishi Order According to the local 'Khadims' at Charar-i-Sharif the number of visitors, belonging to all communities, has increased with time. According to Mr. Ashiq Tak, Sufis exerted a more dominant influence on society in Kashmir, than anywhere else. Thus the harmony and unity of being preached by the 'Rishis' gave birth to peaceful co-existence and mutual respect among Hindus and Muslims of the past centuries. The number of visitors on the day of my visit also substantiated the information provided to me regarding the increasing popularity of the Sufi Shrine Charar-i-Sharif.
- Similarities between Hindu and Sufi 'Rishi' tradition: Apart from advocating ascetism and vegetarianism, Hazrat Noorani and later 'Rishis' practiced meditative techniques very similar to those of Hindus and Buddhists. 'Paseanfaas' or controlling the breathing process is very similar to the 'Hath Yoga' tradition of Pranayam, which has long been practiced by Shaivite Yogis of Kashmir. The 'Vaakhs' of Lalleshwari had a deep influence on the verses composed by Hazrat Noorani.
- Role of women in the Sufi tradition of Kashmir: Hazrat Noorani had accepted a
 woman as his teacher, and this marked a radical departure from tradition. He
 also welcomed women disciples, which was a new concept in those times.
 According to Haji Younus Ahmad, the 'Rishi' order of Kashmir has given a highly

respected place to women Sufis with prominent Sufi Saints like Shama Bibi and Dahat Bibi being held in high esteem even today.

Attached with this report, are some of documents, pictures and pieces of information gathered during my stay at Charar-i-Sharif in Jammu and Kashmir. Some of the literary and historical sources studied for information on this Shrine, Hazrat Noorani and the ideology of 'Rishi Sufism', have been mentioned earlier in this report.

Here is one of the many verses attributed to Hazrat Nooruddin Noorani and translated to English, signifying unity and harmony among Hindus and Muslims:

"We belong to the same parents, then why this difference? Let Hindus and Muslims together worship God alone. We came to this world like partners. We should have shared our joys and sorrows together!"

(2) Visit to 'Dargah' of Azan Fagir, Assam (October, 2015): -

A visit was made by me to the Dargah of Azan Faqir, a renowned Sufi Syed, poet, preacher and saint of Assam. It is situated near Sibosagar in Assam. A journey by road from Guwahati to Sibosagar took five hours. The shrine is highly revered in Assam and attracts people from all faiths since the 17th Century. According to <u>Dr. Painurruddin Ahmad</u>, Professor, Dept. of Islamic Studies (Persian) Cotton College, Guwahati, Azan Faqir's original name was Shah Miran and he was a disciple of Khwaja Nijamuddin Auliya of Baghdad. He came from Baghdad in 1635 and settled in Sibosagar, Assam, where he helped to unify the people of the Brahmaputra Valley. He is particularly known for his 'Zikir' and 'Zari', two forms of devotional songs that drew from the local Assamese musical tradition. According to Dr. Ahmad, Azan Faqir wrote around 160 Zikirs in Assamese mostly between 1635 AD and 1642 AD.

A plethora of information has been collected by me during this visit, which includes interviews with family members of Late Syed Shamsul Huda, Professor of Arabic, Guwahati University and also a descendent of Azan Faqir. Some important Zikirs said to be composed by Azan Pir help in understanding his beliefs and fundamental ethos as well as the ideological similarity between Sufism and Vedanta.

"Sankardeur jiyari madhavdeur bowari, rahpur nagrat ghar,

(This verse has a bearing on the Ratikhowa school of Vaishnavism)

"Hindu musalman ek allar farman.........Gorasthane kabar sari sari,

hindu poriba mominak gariba......"

(Hindus and Muslims are bound by the same set divine rules of Allah. The act of cremating a hindu and entombing a mumin signify one end – death is a universal truth that treats all equally)

A talk with Shri Imdad Ali Ahmad, who has been the Supervisor of Assam Board of Waqf, Guwahati has given valuable information on 'Azan Faqirs' Zikrs. "Some of Azan Faqirs Ziklrs were in the tune of "Naam-Kirtans" of the prevalent Mahapurasia religious sect. Even today, singing of 'Zikirs' produces a spirit of unity among Hindus and Muslims alike. Because of this deep rooted secular and liberal outlook, Assam has largely been free of communal clashes and bitterness, a fact that can be corroborated by records."

According to Dr. M. Parwez Professer, Aligarh Muslim University: - "Azan Faqirs Zikirs contain the unifying spirit of brotherhood and oneness of mankind. There is clear influence of Bhakti doctrines preached by the Saint poet Shankardeva (16th Cen.) on the philosophy of Azan Faqir. The frequent use of words like 'Nama', and respectful references exalting the glory of the revered Vaishnavite saint in the Zikirs, proves this fact. The interaction between Islam and Vaishnavism in Assam helped the growth of a deep sense of mutual respect and tolerance in the minds of its adherents. Sankardeva was taken as Guru by noted muslims like Chand Khan."

The Sufis had in opened the doors of their 'Khagnahs' to all, irrespective of religious beliefs, associated with Hindu 'yogis' and also used local languages in their conversation and discourses. Their benevolent attitude and liberal outlook, as well as their shunning of the outward show of religiosity, all went a long way to create a secular, uniform and composite society in India much before the idea became popular in the western world.

(IV) FUTURE COURSE OF ACTION:

In the first stage of my Research Project the work has been mostly focussed on gathering a multitude of information for analysis, taking notes, recording and collecting sources and documenting the inputs. For this purpose I have adopted the technique of in depth scrutiny of available literature on Sufism in India, in books, journals and electronic sources. Finer points regarding history, spread, organization and tenets of Sufi philosophy could be well understood from the books and articles written by eminent historians. For a study of present day popularity and influence of Sufism in India, and for understanding the regional differences in Sufi beliefs and practices in various parts of the country, visits to two major Sufi centres have been conducted. Interviews and interactions with shrine management members, visitors and local academicians helped in gathering valuable information.

This process will be further extended in the coming weeks and months, while systematic compilation of whatever relevant material that has been already collected, shall go on simultaneously. It is expected that towards the end of Phase I (Ist year of this Project) the analyzing and synthesizing process of collected information shall be well underway. Organizing this information around the questions related to the main themes of this research, and conducting an overview assessment of the field of available information shall be my targets in the later part of the research period. The important themes of this project are related to investigating how Sufism played a seminal role in moulding the secular attitudes of people of India and how it emerged as the torch bearer of cultural integration and religious tolerance in society since the last many centuries. This study focuses on sufi history and philosophy within the domain of today's relevance, hence there will be a constant effort to put the gathered information in perspective- and trace the immense potential of Sufism in social synthesis and harmonization of relations. Visits shall be made to three Sufi shrines and Centers in South and West, zones of the country in the next three months.

(V) DIFFICULTIES AND CHALLENGES FACED DURING RESEARCH:

(a) Language related difficulty:- While the experience of visiting regional Sufi centers like Charar-i-Sharif (Jammu & Kashmir) and Azan Pir Dargah (Assam) were extremely enriching and useful, the language barrier created some difficulty as it was not always easy to interpret or take help of a translator at all times. While trying to communicate with local

'Khadims' and followers at both the places mentioned above, constant effort had to be made to get the right translation of words and phrases.

(b) Doubts regarding Accuracy of Chronology and authenticity of facts:

Due to fragmented information from scattered sources, and distortion (which is a result of the limitations of oral tradition), conflicting pieces of information on events, personalities, and dates, deficiency of contemporary written sources on some aspects of the research, were some of the problems that had to be dealt with in the past months.

- (c) Over abundance of documentation: In the process of collecting and collating the vast amount of information on Sufism at my disposal, there was often a danger of getting distracted by irrelevant data and facts. However, this was overcome with the help of the constant reference to the pre designed work plan of this Research Project.
- (VI) CONCLUSION:- After six months of keen, consistent and thorough enquiry into history, philosophy and regional aspects of Sufism in India, I am convinced that liberal Islam, as represented by Sufism, can be credited with fostering communal harmony and religious tolerance which has immense current relevance in today's turbulent times. Sufis, by their simplicity, open mindedness and strength of character helped in bringing about a rapprochement between Hindus and Muslims in the past. During my interactions with academicians and clerics and through the review of already published information on Sufi ideology, I can easily conclude that the spirit of Sufism holds great promise for future unity and peace in society. Keeping this in mind, this systematic investigation that has been launched will be carried forward to further elucidate and interpret the history, content and impact of Sufism in India.
