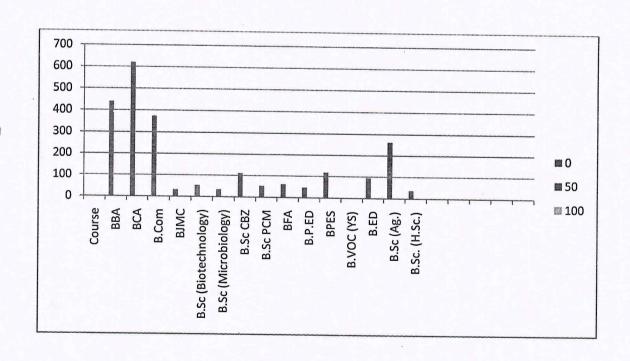

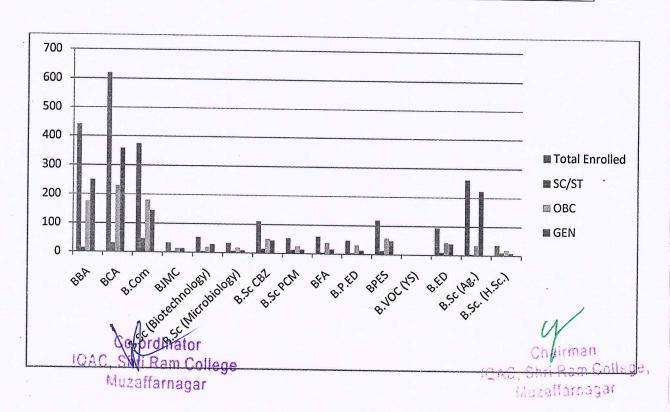

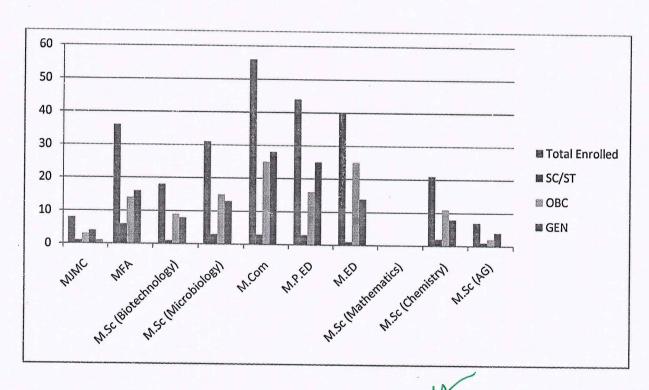

POLICY FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

SRC POLICY FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

Shri Ram College, since its beginning in theyear2004, has been forwarding the idea of philanthropy through its education with values. The College intends to advance a comprehensive and inclusive teaching and learning environment in which incapacitated students or employees are not discriminated or treated unfavorably. The College aims to design its programs, administration, facilities and activities fully accessible to the students irrespective of any physical and mental differences. As a policy matter the College strives to forward a helping hand towards the differently abled people so as to make sure about the benefits of grounds programs, administrations, and activities. These guidelines apply to all the College Students, Faculty and staff.

The National Policy for Persons with Disabilities was formulated in 2006 by the Government of India that deals with educational rehabilitation of persons with disabilities, in view of this policy the College implemented these practices in its education system. The College policy takes the persons who are differently abled as valuable human resource. - 8. To make provisions for enquiry and information: Human assistance, reader, scribe, soft copies of reading material, screen reading.

- To determine major grievances pertaining to any matter of persons with disabilities. If it is not resolved, it should be sent to the principal.

FACILITIES FOR DIFFERENTLY ABLED STUDENTS

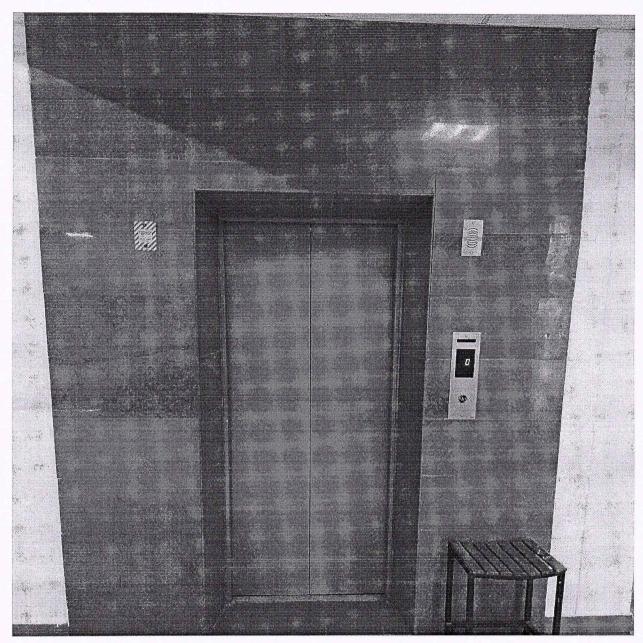

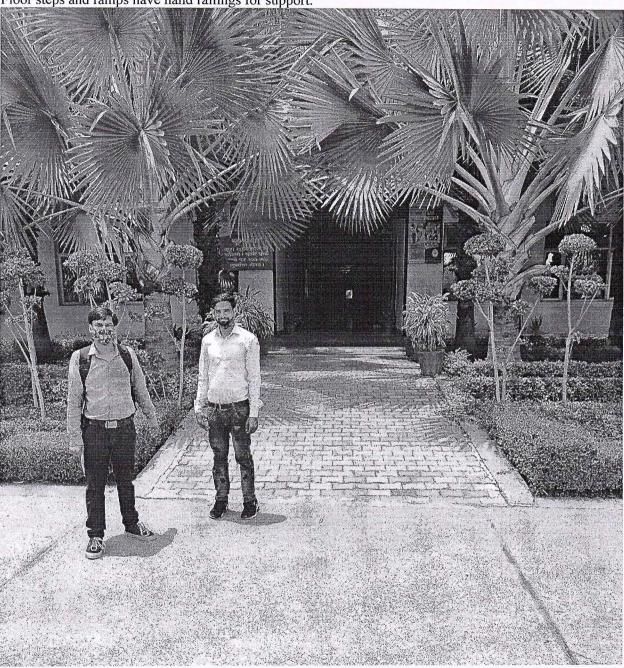

Floor steps and ramps have hand railings for support.



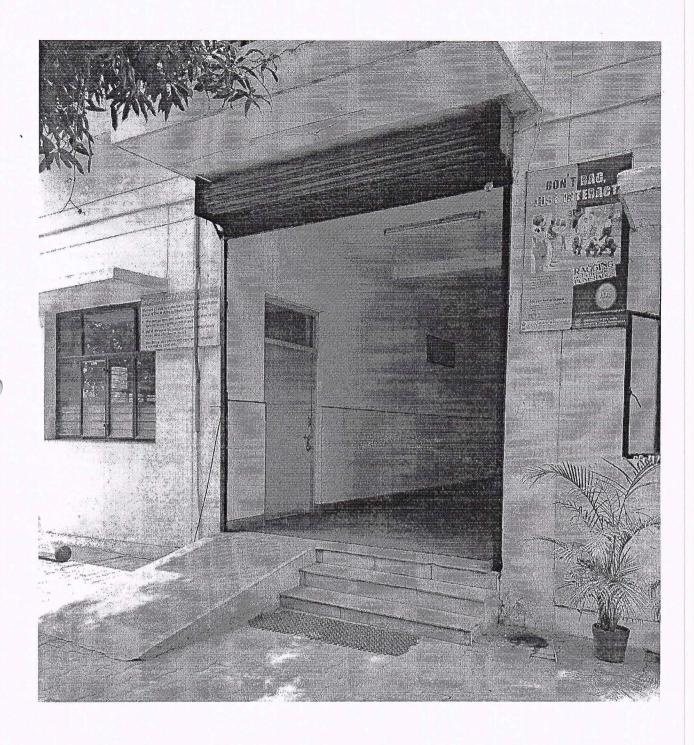

Scribes for Examination:

The university provides or allows the students who find difficulty in writing in the examination to take the help of scribes. The extra time is allowed for disabled students for examinations. As per the Government Circular ED 5 UNE 204/ dated 5.3.2004 and ED 5 UNE 2004, dated 22.3.2004, the following guidelines are to be strictly followed:

- The blind student may select the scribe
- The scribe need not have a qualification lower than that of the student, provided that the scribe should not have the qualification (with the same optional and languages) pertaining to the examination, which the student is writing (for ex: a student who has completed B.A. or M.A. can be a scribe for the students who are taking B.Sc. Examinations)
- A physically disabled / blind / hearing impaired candidate and the scribes for such a candidate shall be allowed an extra time of 20 minutes per hour.
- As the hearing-impaired students are having language problems, possibilities of grammar mistakes, mistakes in building the sentences are there. Hence, the answer papers shall be identified separately and evaluated with additional care.

The body comprises the Director, Principal, Hostel Warden, Chief Finance Controller, and Dean of Academics, all of whom contribute to the decision-making process. Their collaborative efforts ensure that the financial resources are utilized efficiently to meet the needs of the hostel residents while maintaining high standards of service.

Budget Allocation Process:

The hostel management team meets annually to review the financial needs for the upcoming year. Each member provides insights and recommendations based on their respective areas of expertise. This ensures that the budget reflects the priorities of the hostel, balancing immediate needs with long-term improvements.

Budget Categories:

- 1. Mess Operations: A significant portion of the annual budget is allocated to the mess, ensuring that students receive nutritious, high-quality food throughout the year. The mess budget covers expenses such as food procurement, kitchen staff salaries, and maintenance of kitchen facilities. In the past year, approximately 40% of the total budget was allocated to the mess to maintain quality food services and ensure variety in the menu.
- 2. Infrastructure Development & Maintenance: The upkeep of hostel facilities, including common areas, rooms, bathrooms, and other infrastructure, is vital to ensuring a comfortable living environment for students. A portion of the budget is dedicated to regular maintenance as well as any necessary upgrades or repairs. In the last budget allocation, 30% was earmarked for infrastructure development and maintenance, ensuring that all necessary repairs and improvements were made, and that the hostel remains in excellent condition.
- 3. New Purchases & Upgrades: To enhance the student living experience, funds are also set aside for new purchases, including furniture, appliances, study equipment, and any other necessary items. This budget allocation also covers the purchase of materials for new infrastructural projects, such as new furniture, lighting, and equipment. This segment of the budget typically accounts for 15% of the total annual budget.
- 4. **Maintenance Work:** Ensuring the proper functioning of essential services, such as plumbing, electrical systems, and waste management, is crucial for the daily operation of the hostel. Regular maintenance work, which includes repairs, system checks, and routine services, is funded through this allocation. Last year, 15% of the budget was directed

towards maintenance work, addressing issues related to plumbing, electrical faults, and other facility concerns.

Steps in Budget Approval:

The budget allocation process follows a systematic procedure to ensure transparency and effectiveness:

- 1. **Initial Planning:** The hostel warden collaborates with the Chief Finance Controller and the Director to draft an initial budget proposal based on past expenditures and anticipated needs.
- 2. **Discussion and Review:** The draft budget is presented to the management body, where it is discussed, adjusted, and refined according to feedback from the Principal, Dean of Academics, and other members.
- 3. **Final Approval:** After revisions, the final budget is approved by the management body, ensuring that all categories receive adequate funding and that there is a balance between long-term investment and immediate needs.

By ensuring a clear, detailed, and well-planned budget, the hostel management is able to provide a high-quality living experience for students while maintaining financial discipline and sustainability. This systematic approach to budget management has helped meet the needs of the students, from food services to infrastructure, while allowing for future growth and improvements.

Challenges Faced

While the hostel has been successful in creating a vibrant and engaging environment for students, several challenges have surfaced throughout the year. These challenges were related to maintenance, student behavior, and infrastructure, all of which required attention to ensure the smooth functioning of the hostel. The following sections outline the key issues faced and the steps taken to address them:

1. Maintenance Issues: One of the recurring challenges faced in the hostel was the upkeep and maintenance of facilities. This included issues with plumbing, electrical wiring, and regular wear and tear of hostel rooms and common areas. With approximately 1096 students living in a facility designed for 1152, maintaining the cleanliness and functionality of the hostel facilities became a constant challenge.

Challenges:

- 15% of the hostel rooms experienced plumbing issues during the year.
- Electrical malfunctions in 8% of common areas were reported.
- 5% of the furniture in the common areas and rooms required replacement due to wear and tear.

Steps Taken:

- A routine maintenance schedule was established, ensuring that any damage or faults were identified and repaired quickly. Over the year, 75% of reported issues were resolved within 48 hours.
- A dedicated team of 5 maintenance staff was designated for regular checks and prompt repairs.
- 20 professional service providers were engaged for larger repair work, ensuring quality and long-lasting solutions.
- A feedback mechanism was put in place, allowing students to report any maintenance issues, with 85% of the reports addressed within 24 hours.
- 2. Student Behavior: Maintaining discipline and a positive environment within the hostel was sometimes challenging due to differences in behavior, particularly concerning noise levels, cleanliness, and respect for common spaces. Issues such as late-night disturbances, improper disposal of waste, and non-compliance with hostel rules occasionally arose, affecting the peaceful living experience of students.

Challenges:

- 12 instances of noise disturbances were reported, with complaints from 10% of the residents.
- 8 cases of improper waste disposal were observed during the year.
- 5 disciplinary violations occurred, including late-night gatherings and disrespecting common areas.

Steps Taken:

- A clear set of rules and guidelines was shared with all 1096 students at the beginning of the academic year to ensure everyone understood the expected behavior.
- 10 meetings were held with hostel residents to address concerns, promote respectful conduct, and foster open communication.
- Notices and reminders regarding hostel policies were put up in common areas, with 100% visibility among residents.
- A disciplinary committee was formed to address severe behavioral issues, with 3 students facing suspension due to repeated violations.
- Awareness programs and counseling sessions were organized for 150 students, focusing on maintaining harmony and respecting others' living spaces.
- **3. Infrastructure Challenges:** With a large number of students residing in the hostel, maintaining adequate infrastructure, such as sufficient lighting, ventilation, and furniture, proved to be an ongoing challenge. The increasing number of students also led to issues like overcrowding in some areas, which made it difficult to maintain comfort and privacy for all residents.

Challenges:

- Overcrowding in the common areas, especially during peak hours, was reported by 25% of the residents.
- 20% of rooms had inadequate ventilation, leading to complaints about air circulation.
- 15% of the hostel furniture needed replacement due to wear and tear.

Steps Taken:

- Plans were initiated to upgrade the infrastructure, focusing on better ventilation, lighting, and furniture replacement. 10 rooms were upgraded with new furniture and better ventilation by the end of the year.
- Additional lighting fixtures were installed in 30% of common areas, and 40% of rooms received new furniture to improve comfort and functionality.
- A new space utilization plan was developed to optimize common areas, resulting in a 30% reduction in overcrowding in high-traffic areas.
- Partnerships with external vendors were established to ensure quality and timely delivery of infrastructure improvements, with a total of 20 service contracts signed.
- **4. Hygiene & Cleanliness:** Keeping the hostel premises clean and hygienic was another area of concern. Inadequate waste disposal practices, the need for frequent cleaning of bathrooms, and maintaining the overall cleanliness of hostel rooms and corridors posed challenges for hostel staff.

Challenges:

- 18% of residents reported dissatisfaction with the cleanliness of common areas.
- 6% of rooms required additional cleaning due to improper waste disposal by residents.
- The bathrooms needed cleaning more frequently, with complaints from 15% of the residents.

Steps Taken:

- A more structured cleaning schedule was implemented, with hostel staff responsible for cleaning rooms, bathrooms, and common areas twice a day. This resulted in a 95% satisfaction rate with cleanliness among residents.
- Waste segregation bins were installed in all common areas, and 80% of students adopted proper waste disposal practices.
- Awareness campaigns on cleanliness were conducted for all 1096 students, and 75% of the residents attended these sessions, leading to improved hygiene practices.
- Regular checks were carried out to ensure proper waste management, with 98% of waste disposed of properly by the end of the year.

By addressing these challenges with clear policies, proactive steps, and student engagement, the hostel strived to provide a better and more harmonious living experience for all its residents. These actions not only improved the overall hostel environment but also helped in fostering a sense of community and responsibility among students.

Hostel Feedback & Suggestion

The hostel values the feedback and suggestions of both students and staff, as it plays a crucial role in identifying areas for improvement and ensuring that the needs of the residents are met effectively. Throughout the year, both formal and informal channels for feedback have been established, providing an opportunity for students and staff to voice their opinions, express concerns, and suggest ways to enhance the overall hostel experience.

Feedback from Students:

Students are at the heart of the hostel's operations, and their feedback is actively sought to improve the quality of their living experience. Regular feedback sessions, surveys, and suggestion boxes are used to collect input on various aspects of hostel life. Some of the most common areas where students provided feedback include:

1. Quality of Food:

- o Many students expressed a desire for more variety in the menu, especially during weekends and festivals.
- Suggestions were made for including more vegetarian and health-conscious options.
- o A few students raised concerns about the timing of meals and requested flexibility in meal hours, particularly for students with different schedules.

2. Cleanliness and Hygiene:

- Students suggested improving the cleanliness of common areas, especially during peak times when many students gather in shared spaces.
- The need for regular cleaning of bathrooms and better waste management practices were frequently mentioned.

3. Maintenance and Infrastructure:

- o Students requested better ventilation in certain rooms and common areas, especially during the summer months.
- A few students recommended upgrading the furniture in the common areas and adding more seating arrangements for socializing and study purposes.
- Several students expressed the need for additional study spaces and quiet zones.

4. Cultural and Recreational Activities:

- o Students showed interest in more diverse cultural and recreational events, such as themed parties, talent shows, and hobby workshops.
- o A few students suggested organizing more inter-hostel competitions and teambuilding activities.

5. Discipline and Environment:

- o A few students suggested implementing stricter enforcement of hostel rules, particularly regarding noise levels and curfew times.
- Feedback was received about the need for better security measures, including more frequent patrols and increased awareness about safety.

6. Feedback from Staff:

The hostel staff, who work diligently to ensure smooth operations, also provide valuable input regarding the functioning of the hostel. Their feedback often focuses on operational aspects, maintenance needs, and the well-being of the students. Some key suggestions from the staff include:

1. Staff Training:

 Staff members suggested implementing regular training programs to enhance their skills, particularly in areas such as customer service, conflict resolution, and safety procedures.

2. Maintenance Efficiency:

 Staff recommended a more streamlined system for reporting and addressing maintenance issues to ensure quicker resolution of problems, especially in hightraffic areas.

3. Communication with Students:

 Staff suggested increasing communication between hostel management and students to ensure a better understanding of each other's needs and concerns. This could include more frequent meetings or digital platforms for real-time updates.

4. Improved Coordination:

o Some staff suggested improving coordination between the hostel management and the external vendors or service providers for quicker turnaround times for services such as cleaning, food delivery, or repairs.

Suggestions for Improvement:

Based on the feedback from both students and staff, several key suggestions have been identified for improvement:

1. Enhanced Meal Planning:

o Incorporating more variety in the food menu, including additional healthy and vegetarian options, will be explored. Additionally, efforts will be made to accommodate flexible meal timings to meet the needs of students with varying schedules.

2. Improvement in Cleanliness and Hygiene:

 A revised cleaning schedule will be implemented, ensuring that common areas, bathrooms, and rooms are maintained consistently throughout the day. Waste segregation bins will be added in all common spaces to promote cleanliness and recycling.

3. Infrastructure Upgrades:

 Efforts will be made to upgrade ventilation systems in rooms and common areas, with priority given to high-demand zones. Further, additional study spaces and quiet zones will be created to cater to students who need focused study environments.

4. Cultural and Recreational Activities:

The hostel management will focus on organizing more diverse cultural activities, such as talent shows, music nights, and sports tournaments. Additionally, inter-

hostel competitions will be introduced to foster teamwork and community spirit among students.

5. Stronger Discipline and Safety:

The hostel management will implement measures to improve discipline, such as regular reminders of hostel rules and better monitoring of common areas. Increased security measures will also be considered, such as more frequent patrols and enhanced lighting in and around the hostel premises.

6. Staff Development:

 Regular training programs will be arranged for staff to enhance their skills and improve overall service quality. This will also include training on managing student concerns and ensuring the safety of students.

7. Streamlined Maintenance Requests:

o A more efficient system for reporting maintenance issues will be introduced, with a dedicated team for immediate response and regular follow-ups. This will ensure that repairs and maintenance work are completed promptly.

The hostel management takes these suggestions seriously and will continue to work towards addressing the needs of students and staff. Through continuous feedback and proactive improvements, the hostel strives to create a better living and learning environment for all its residents.

7. Hostel Plans for the Next Year

Looking ahead to the coming year, the hostel management is committed to continuing its efforts to provide an optimal living and learning environment for its residents. Several upgrades and initiatives are planned to enhance both the infrastructure and student experience. These proposed plans are aimed at improving hostel facilities, increasing student engagement, and ensuring the long-term sustainability of the hostel.

Proposed Upgrades and Initiatives for the Coming Year

1. Infrastructure Upgrades:

- o Room Renovations: A key focus will be on upgrading the rooms, particularly those with inadequate ventilation and older furniture. New furniture will be introduced, along with improvements to the electrical and plumbing systems. This will ensure that all 1096 students have access to comfortable, modern living spaces.
- Common Area Enhancements: To promote social interaction and collaboration among students, the common areas will be expanded and furnished with additional seating arrangements. This includes both recreational spaces and study zones. Moreover, lounges will be equipped with multimedia facilities to support social and academic activities.
- o Improved Ventilation and Lighting: Given the need for better air circulation, several rooms and common areas will undergo modifications to enhance ventilation. LED lighting will be installed to ensure brighter, energy-efficient spaces.

- o Wi-Fi Upgrades: The hostel's internet infrastructure will be upgraded to ensure fast, reliable, and secure Wi-Fi access for all residents, particularly in study and common areas, to support academic and recreational needs.

5. Health and Well-being Initiatives:

- o Health Camps and Counseling Services: Regular health check-ups will be organized for students, along with mental health awareness programs. A dedicated counseling corner will be set up to help students with personal or academic challenges.
- o **Fitness Programs:** A fitness center will be created, offering students access to gym equipment and wellness programs like yoga and fitness classes. Additionally, outdoor sports activities will be promoted through regular fitness challenges and competitions.

Long-term Goals for the Hostel

1. Sustainability and Eco-friendly Practices:

o Green Initiatives: In the coming years, the hostel aims to implement eco-friendly practices, such as waste segregation, water conservation measures, and the use of solar energy for heating and lighting. Recycling bins will be installed across common areas to encourage sustainability, and students will be educated about reducing their environmental footprint.

Courses/Programmes Conducted:

1. Trade Skills

Basics of Electrical Work

This programme focused on equipping students with fundamental skills in electrical wiring and maintenance. It included practical training sessions conducted by Mr. Rajesh Sharma, a certified electrician with over 15 years of industry experience.

- Objective: To develop hands-on skills in basic electrical tasks.
- Duration: 3 weeks (30 hours)
- Budget: INR 25,000
- Courses Covered: BSc Basic Sciences, BCom
- Preparation: Practical workstations were set up, and electrical kits were procured for student use.

CNC Machining Workshop

This workshop aimed at introducing students to CNC machine operations and basics of quality control in manufacturing. Mr. Manoj Verma, an industry expert, led the sessions.

- Objective: To train students in advanced machining techniques and quality assurance.
- Duration: 2 weeks (20 hours)
- Budget: INR 40,000
- Courses Covered: BBA, MBA
- Preparation: Collaborated with local manufacturing units for practical exposure and arranged necessary machinery.

2. Health Sciences

First Aid and Emergency Services Certification

This certification programme aimed to provide essential skills in first aid and emergency response. Dr. Pooja Malik, a certified EMT trainer, delivered the training sessions.

- Objective: To empower students with lifesaving first aid techniques.
- Duration: 1 week (10 hours)
- Budget: INR 15,000
- Courses Covered: BSc Basic Sciences, MCom
- Preparation: Procured first aid kits and training materials for practical demonstrations.

3. Information Technology
